- Lots of Northern in the 12-20 inch range.
- Bluegills are hitting good.
- Ice is 30-36 inches thick

Water Quality

George reported the following

- Plans on taking water sample in 6 weeks
- Received the report back from Stevens Point and reported the following
 - Phosphates has changed below 6 (more acidic) Phosphates had been running 7.5
- Sulfates have changed to 1.5 million per liter to over 5.0

George suspects that the results are in error.

Old Business

- Boat Landing Culvert
 - This has not been fixed yet. Should be fixed in spring once the thaw is done. Doug Noetzel will follow up on this.
- Boat Landing Pier
 - Stan gave the following report
 - Estimated cost is \$450-\$500
 - Dock would be approximately 20 feet long 4 feet wide
 - Wood will be arsenic free and heavy duty
 - Utilizing metal pipes so it can be adjusted
 - Dock will stay in year round

Fish Cribs

- Application is filed and have not received approval
- Cribs do not need to be built in winter
- o Can also be built in warm weather and moved into position.
- o Project on hold until Frank returns

• Dry Hydrant Proposal

- o Item on hold until we can follow up with Frank.
- o Concerns about how this would affect the lake level.
- o Butch thought that this would need approval from DNR
- o May need soil tests.
- Dredge 10 feet deep and would that draw water from the lake to Springstead Creek
- o Dry hydrant would be very nice
- Butch also mentioned that another option we should explore is to bury a 10,000 gallon tank below the frost level in a centralized location.
 Butch will get cost info and give this to Karen.
- o Plan on more clarification and discussion at the May meeting

DOT

 DNR trying to change the amount from 50 to 75 gallons per registered boat in WI to divert from DOT. This would provide more funds for lakes versus DOT use.

NEW BUSINESS

- Karen received complaints about snowmobile speeds on the lake along with noise and having them disturb the wildlife
- o ATV Survey
 - Need to make Cy's a trail
 - Towns are not allowed to make a road an access to a route.
 However a town can make it a route.
 - Doug reported that survey responses are running 3-1 in favor
 - Typical speed on an ATV is 15-20 MPH
 - ATV routes legally must follow the speed limits posted for cars
 - Doug plans to put on the town agenda for 3/25/03
